- We hosted a blood drive event in November at our RAMP office. The collection efforts will potentially help nearly 50 people with blood needs. Additionally, Vitalant provided meals to the food bank based on our donors.
- The REALTORS® Education Institute continues to experience strong performance. REI has offered
  more and more varied classes during the year including 2020 continuing ed requirements,
  designation opportunities and broker classes. It did so while having to navigate a new landscape of
  virtual classes. I taught the first virtual class and I have to say that REI staff did such an amazing job
  getting everything started from scratch. My class went off virtually without a hitch. (pun intended)
- Our YPN Committee is running a food drive with drop off locations throughout the county at member offices and RAMP headquarters.
- Our Government Affairs Committee does so much that it blows me away. Their report lists so many

#### 2020, a Year in Review

It's clear that this year has been a trying one for all of us, all around the globe. COVID-19 has essentially changed everything we do, not only as real estate professionals, but also as people in general. It has made us think differently, act differently, and respond differently to a scenario not really previously considered.

I don't know about you, but personally, this year has been a humbling one and has allowed me to look inward and remember what is important to me, my family, and my loved ones. It has given me – and most likely everyone reading this – an opportunity to reconnect with ourselves in a way we haven't in a long time. But, most importantly, this year has taught me a lot about myself, and my ability to adapt, to change, and to persevere.

And RAMP is no different. 2020 has made us stronger as an Association altogether. It's made us more flexible, adaptable, and ready to take on any challenge. When we couldn't do in-person classes – boom – virtual classes. When we couldn't meet in person for board meetings – boom – virtual sessions. Though we may not have had the year we were expecting, everyone stuck together and made sure our voices were heard, and everyone helped RAMP to move forward when every opportunity was there to fall back.

#### **Financial Recap**

It's been a trying year, sure, but RAMP and the Finance Committee are happy to share that we have persevered through 2020 and have a positive report to present:

#### REPORT OF THE SECRETARY-TREASURER

- First and foremost, it is important to understand that while Association income is down about 4.3% year-over-year due to COVID-19 and the subsequent loss of event income, expenses are also down greatly by 18.8% in various categories, but mainly events and travel.
- So, actually, our year-over-year income over expenses has been up about 14.2%
- Our reserve accounts remain healthy.
- Our investment account has almost fully recovered to its pre-pandemic level, being down only 2.2%
- RAMP's property next door at 1415 W. Liberty saw the vacation of its former tenant, but at the quick
  response of Jerry Speer and the Commercial Committee, they were able to get the space filled with a
  new commercial tenant. Non dues revenue allows us to keep dues level.
- RAMP needed to make some improvements to their headquarters (HVAC systems needed to be repaired/replaced), and it was decided to replace the units. This is what the reserve accounts are there for.
- In accordance with the National Association of REALTORS ® Core Standards, RAMP follows strict guidelines and financial policies including an annual review by an independent CPA firm. This year's review showed that our policies, procedures, and accounting methods were all satisfactory, well-executed, and met or exceeded the core standards set by NAR. These reports are available for review by any member. All you have to do is ask to see them.
- Member dues were not increased and haven't in the last 10+ years

This has been a year for the history books to say the very least. It has taken long hours, many meetings, and a lot of tough decisions from so many individuals to help keep RAMP moving forward, despite the challenges we have faced. I wanted to give a special thank you to the entire RAMP staff for working diligently to keep us on track, to keep us moving, and to keep us creative. Your willingness to go the extra mile has absolutely helped us be successful. Thank you!

I would also like to thank the Finance Committee, the Board of Directors, and all of our members for your incredible support. What a year to be a Secretary-Treasurer. I have learned so much and have experienced more than I ever anticipated in this role. Thank you for trusting me with this great responsibility and I look forward to continuing to serve RAMP and its members.

## The Legal Scene

What a remarkable year this has been. We are in the midst of a pandemic, real estate was designated as a 'non-essential' element of our daily lives, interest rates for mortgages hit all-time lows, and when Realtors were permitted to practice their profession we saw a volume of transactions that were higher than anything we've seen since at least the early 2000's. How have all of these changes, events and pandemics affected the legal scene for RAMP Members?

I am pleased to report that the legal affairs of the Association for 2020 have been healthy. Working with this year's leadership team has been very rewarding and they are to be commended for how they helped the Association navigate many of the uncertainties that have confronted our Members. Working closely with Executive Vice-President John Petrack, and Professional Standards and Arbitration Committee Secretary Eileen Baehr, RAMP's legal affairs continue to be managed professionally, and are in very good order.

We continue to see an increase in both complaints filed against RAMP Members, and several of those complaints have been elevated to hearings or arbitrations; sometimes both! We all take great pride in maintaining the high ethical standards of RAMP Members. It seems that the urgency of the market has been compounded by the stresses and uncertainties generated by COVID-19. These frustrations seem to be bleeding into transactions. Many times complaints stem from misunderstandings or miscommunications; sometimes the allegations are very serious. When the complaints are filed, they are reviewed by the Grievance Committee. Those complaints that warrant further consideration are heard by the Professional Standards and Arbitration Committee and are promptly addressed. Both of these committees bring credit to the Association with their professionalism, impartiality, and good judgment.

We continue to keep an eye on developments coming out of the Governor's Office as the administration continues to evaluate the spreading of the virus and takes steps responding to the circumstances. Executive Orders should be viewed as law, unless there are specific instructions to the contrary. For example, an Executive Order might state that some or all of the provisions in a given Order are 'strongly encouraged' while other Orders might 'mandate' certain behaviors. The State Real Estate Commission is charged with enforcing the laws of the Commonwealth and this does include mandates initiated through Executive Orders. In these instances we need to put our personal views aside and lead by example. That means keep up to date on the information circulated by NAR, PAR and RAMP. It is incumbent upon all Realtors to know what is required and what is recommended, and to adhere to the practices and procedures implemented by your brokers.

We continue to be proactive in our efforts to assure that RAMP avoids legal difficulties and complies with governing laws and regulations. I continue to attend all meetings of the Board of Directors, the Professional Standards and Arbitration Committee, the Grievance Committee, and when necessary, meetings of the Executive Committee. This year, I attended the virtual NAR Annual Conference in an effort to continue to provide RAMP with cutting edge information that may affect how its Members practice real estate.

Despite being shut down for a few months due to COVID-19 quarantine, REALTORS® Educational Institute had a remarkably great year, serving over 1,800 students with a faculty of over 50 experts. We educated students from all areas of Western Pennsylvania in our designation, broker, pre-license, and continuing education programs. In addition to having education programs for real estate licensees and appraisers, we expanded to include all real estate related education including programs for attorneys. We believe in the importance of providing education that helps members increase their skills, proficiency, knowledge and professionalism. We offered six designations/certifications in the past year including the Senior Real Estate Specialist, Accredited Buyers Representative, ePRO, and Green.

Our pre-license class enrollment numbers are steady. Except for a dip in enrollment due to COVID-19 from April – June, we have averaged about 50 students in these monthly classes (in class and online). Great prices, a consistent program, and an exceptional faculty attracts students from all over Southwestern Pennsylvania. Due to courses being virtual now, we have seen students enroll from other areas in Pennsylvania which boosts enrollment numbers. Our students keep proving the excellence of our program with higher than average State Exam results. Hard work, communication, great instructors, and fine-tuning curriculum is to credit.

Broker courses are doing very well this year with increased enrollment since the COVID quarantine when we were shut down for a few months. REI is the only school with a complete broker program in Western Pennsylvania. Students have the opportunity to complete the 16 credit education requirement in about one year from the date they begin, and students can start at any time. Because of the completeness of our program and an exceptional faculty, our broker program is the top program in the region. We offer a mix of day and evening classes (and online classes) to accommodate real estate professionals on different schedules. This is a great help to our members seeking a license upgrade.

We added new walking tours for CE credit in the Market Square Area, the Cultural District, Mexican War Streets, and Mount Lebanon. After COVID hit, faculty worked together to very successfully and effectively convert the walking tours to virtual tours using google maps, video recording of tours, and photography.

Continuing education went well for license renewal deadline which was extended to August 29, 2020. COVID certainly gave us a challenge but faculty pulled together with training for a terrific virtual education program. REI offered members and students free one-on-one training to use Zoom in order to get their hours completed. We have a knowledgeable team of instructors offering many new interesting courses which met the needs of our members. We plan on continually expanding our onsite and virtual CE program and plan to provide education for 13 brokerages/organizations virtual or in-person whenever that is feasible.



Credentials & Campaign Rules requested to add a social media audit of a candidate. This action was approved

**Legal Action Committee** had three action items. Item 1 - was to support a case in the amount 14,623.50 to assist in a challenge against an ordinance that affects private property rights. Item 2 - was to obtain a policy in the amount of 1,740,060 to protect associations and members that own a MLS. Item 3 - that NAR purchase a Patent Infringement Liability Policy at a cost of 129,469. All three were approved

**Multiple Listing Issues & Policies Committee** had eight action items. All were advanced. Item 1 - to add sanctions and disciplinary guidelines and to enforce. Items 2 and 3 together, that if an individual violates three sanctions in one year, they must go to a hearing. Item 4 - MLS to process a complaint without revealing the complainant's name. Item 5 - that Web API data access provided to participants and subscribers. Item 6 - that users provide accurate data and be required to correct any known errors. Item 7 - MLS to be required to provide tech support/customer service, was approved. Item 8 - MLS to provide a policy of identifying potential fair housing violations.

**Conventional Financing and Policy Committee** had one action item, That FHFA leadership be changed from one (1) person to a five (5) person panel, was approved

**Federal Taxation Committee** had two action items, Item 1 - to support tax policies that provide a targeted, additional gain exclusion or other tax relief to older homeowners and others that have lived in principal residence and have unrealized gains much higher than current law maximum exclusions, was approved. Item 2 - to support policies that provide tax incentives to lower the barriers to the creation of more residential units available for purchase for the purpose to balance out housing inventory, was approved

**Land Use Property Rights & Environment Committee** had one action item to revise the Land use, Property Rights & Environmental Policy positions to clarify, update and to modernize the existing statements.

Professional Standards Committee had six actions items, Items 1 through 3 were grouped together, to amend Policy Statement about REALTORS® using harassing/hate speech, slurs, on race, sex, color, handicap, family status, national origin, sexual orientation, or gender identity and establishing sanctioning guidelines. Item 4 - is a final approval request that adds a clear message to Policy Statement 29 that NAR is committed to the highest ethical standards for its members, effective upon final approval. Item 5 also for final approval to send a clear message that NAR condemns speech and conduct, becomes effective immediately. Item 6 - that the definition of "Public Trust" include all discrimination against the protected classes under Article 10 of the Code of Ethics and all fraud, and limit the reporting requirement to final ethics decisions involving real estate related activities and transactions, was also approved

As the COVID-19 Pandemic swept the globe, Government Affairs was faced with some of the strongest challenges for our industry. Real estate in Pennsylvania was shut down, Realtors® were deemed non-essential, and our memberships livelihoods were in jeopardy. Our association and its membership mobilized en masse to get us back to work and do so safely. Realtors® have always worked in the best interest of their clients, their communities, and public safety. Our job this year was to leverage all the political connections we had and communicate with one strong voice to all levels of government. Housing is essential and we were willing to fight for that fundamental idea.

#### Issues Advocacy: Fighting to Make Realtors® Essential

We took our fight to Congress with the CARES Act; pushing for federal remote notary legislation, direct cash stimulus to citizens, disaster/emergency loans to small businesses and brokerages, federal rent relief funding, and possibly most importantly guaranteeing that the pandemic unemployment program included independently contracting Realtors®.

While our federal government and 49 of 50 states deemed real estate an essential business, Pennsylvania Realtors® were shut down for months. We mobilized our Realtor® Champion state legislative allies to craft House Bill 2412 that would have mandated that real estate was an essential business. Realtors® responded to our call for actions, thousands mobilizing across the state, and earning bipartisan passage of the bill. Unfortunately, the bill was vetoed by the Governor, but not before he was pressured to make real estate essential by executive order. Additionally, we helped pass state remote notary laws, helped push online education classes, and helped fix the backlogged pandemic unemployment system.

Locally, Government Affairs had to deal with COVID-19 issues at the county and municipal level. Many municipal offices and inspectors were not handling in person inspections for occupancy, permitting, and sewer tests. Government Affairs, created proposals for the URA to decrease blight and increase the housing stock. Currently we are on the front lines of the eviction moratorium and rent relief fights. We are working to ensure both tenants and landlords rights and livelihoods are protected. As we look towards to 2021, we will need you all to fight increases in property and transfer taxes while making sure we promote increasing affordable housing.

#### **Organizational Growth and Adaptation**

As COVID-19 limited many in person operations, Government Affairs adapted to become more mobile. Our committee and our task forces continued to operate over ZOOM. We conversed with more elected officials that ever before electronically. We vastly expanded the network of members and brokers during the early stages of COVID-19 when correct information was hard to come by. RAMP's Government Affairs remained a strong resource of information.

#### **Candidate Support and Screening**

Given the contentious and crucial nature of the 2020 political elections; Government Affairs conducted candidate interviews for state legislative and federal legislative offices. Recommendations were passed to the PA RPAC trustees. As of November 11th, all PA RPAC endorsed state and federal legislative candidates in Allegheny County are either ahead in their races or have been declared victorious.

The Community Service Committee of RAMP provides an opportunity for members to serve the southwestern Pennsylvania communities. The pandemic may have changed some of our planned activities but it did not stop us. 2020 proved to be an extremely busy year. The following are the projects that the Committee organized and completed:

#### **Our Daily Bread**

Committee members prepared lunch for the homeless and underemployed of our community on May 20th. They gathered to stuff lunch bags with nutritious snacks for over 100 people. Those bags along with freshly grilled burgers and kielbasa were served on Pittsburgh's North Side.

#### **Curb Appeal Day**

The Committee's annual Senior Curb Appeal Day consists of members visiting the homes of local senior citizens who are physically unable to maintain the basic curb appeal of their homes. Members pull weeds, plant flowers and spread mulch.



Unfortunately, due to the pandemic, we felt the need to reimagine this project. Members unloaded boxes of donated clothing, sorted and folded the items and stocked the store shelves. These items will be distributed to those in need who will have an opportunity to visit their store.

They coordinate with other organizations in the Northside to ensure that a hot meal is available every day of the week.

The Committee provided a food truck from Carnivores/The Pub of 333/The Lot from the Oakmont area. For lunch, each person was given a hamburger and hot dog, french fries, soup, granola bar, bottled water and cupcakes. We served over 160 meals.
